
harities depend on supporters to pursue their mission, and supporters—whether they are private foundations, corporations, or individual donors—want to know that their contributions make a difference.


In a data-driven society, some institutional funders seek to identify impactful organizations in a quantifiable way. How individual donors perceive the issue of charity impact is less understood. Our recent *Give.org Donor Trust Report on Charity Impact* explored how the donating public understands the term "charity impact" and how important "impact" is in their giving process. The report provided results of a survey of more than 2,100 adults in the United States (as well as a separate survey of more than 1,000 adults in Canada) and explored how individual donors perceive charity impact.

While it has become a common assumption that donors want to support highly impactful organizations, survey results showed that the donating public does not have a clear understanding of what the term means.

47% of survey participants indicated they are either unclear or do not know what "charity impact" means. The remaining 53% of respondents claimed they know what a charity means when talking about "impact."

The results were also a reminder that charities need to be aware not only of what they say, but also of what potential donors hear. When it comes to the term "charity impact," it turns out people from different generations and giving levels may respond to different messages.





When asked to consider possible definitions for the term "charity impact," survey participants were split, with significant generational differences. For example, Gen Zers are most likely to define "charity impact" as "organizations reaching defined goals" (40%); Millennials were most likely to select "how efficient the organization was in its spending" (27%); and Matures most frequently select "the quality of programs" (26%).¹

Similarly, respondents with different giving levels were split about how to best describe the term. People of giving levels between \$51 and \$5,000, for example, were most likely to define "charity impact" as "organizations reaching defined goals." People who donated more than \$5,000 were most likely to define "charity impact" in terms of "how efficient the organization was in its spending."

Broadly speaking, charity impact refers to how these organizations make a difference. Still, finding uniform ways for charities to quantify or communicate their "impact" is complicated. Optimistically, charity impact information can help individual charities improve or become more efficient, and it can help impactful charities attract support. At a macro level, charity impact information has the potential to help direct social investment toward more effective organizations.

On the flip side, charity impact metrics can fail to account for differences in context across charities and remove the choice on how to measure impact from the charity's leadership in favor of some constituents.

As a wise giver, keep in mind that:

- As mission-driven organizations, charities have an obligation to monitor their effectiveness and seek to improve their "impact."
- To be thoughtful and precise in measuring impact, charities need to consider their unique context and mission work. Charities with similar mission work can legitimately measure impact in different ways.
- While charities can have different ways to measure and communicate impact, wise donors should look for specificity and clarity in the charity's communication.
- Donors are drivers of change. If you care about long-term results, for example, look for impact statements that show the charity has the same priorities.

hen giving, we often worry whether the charity we are giving to is trustworthy.

As a donor encountering a new charity, or revisiting a familiar one, we often want to engage with them to find out more about how they approach the causes we care about, but do not know how. Some donors also want to donate to charities in new ways, for example, via cryptocurrency. Overall, we have come to recognize that personal data is valuable, yet we hear the constant stories about company data hacks, breaches, and the unauthorized sharing of personal information.

With these issues in mind, BBB WGA launched GiveSafely.io. GiveSafely is an online donation platform that provides donors a safe way to give to trusted charities via credit card or cryptocurrency. GiveSafely uses blockchain technology to secure donor data and rewards donors for sharing personal information with charity experiences around causes they care about. GiveSafely takes no transaction fees.

GiveSafely only lists trustworthy charities:

Unlike platforms which list all charities—trustworthy or not—on GiveSafely, donors only find charities that have been accredited by the BBB. This means that each charity's governance, results reporting, finances, and fundraising practices have been evaluated and the charities all meet the 20 BBB Standards for Charity Accountability.

GiveSafely secures donor data with blockchain technology: All data shared by donors is encrypted directly onto the blockchain. Thanks to this technology, there is no central database of donor information that could be hacked, monetized, sold to third parties, or misused. GiveSafely has no contact with donations or

donor data. Donors choose what data to share, and the data only goes to the charity they donate to and the charity with whom they redeem their rewards.

GiveSafely rewards donors with charity experiences around causes they care about:

When giving, donors are required to provide their name and email address. This automatically earns the donor three GivingPoints. Each additional piece of information a donor chooses to share (age, annual income, gender, etc.) will earn them additional GivingPoints. Donors can later redeem these GivingPoints for experiences listed by any of the charities. For example, a donor could sign up for a 15-minute conversation with a charity staff person about a particular cause and learn more about that organization and its programs.

GiveSafely allows donors to give cryptocurrency to charities: On GiveSafely, in addition to credit card donations, donors can give their Bitcoin, Ethereum and Ardor to the listed charities. Cryptocurrency adoption is on the rise, especially among younger donors. A December 2020 Give.org poll of 2,000 adults across the US found that 23% of Millennials and 25% of Gen Zers owned cryptocurrency. Of those who did not own cryptocurrency, 14% of Millennials and 19% of Gen Zers expected to within the next 5 years. Similarly, 78% of Millennials and 73% of Gen Zers indicated that they would consider making donations via cryptocurrency. We are working closely with our Accredited Charities to help build their capacities around cryptocurrency.

THE GOOD NEWS ABOUT ABOUT GIVING IN 2020

he big news from *Giving USA 2021* is that, seemingly against all odds, there was a 5.1% increase (3.8% when adjusted for inflation) in American charitable giving in 2020, with \$471.44 billion donated in the face of economic and social unrest and a global pandemic. Produced by the Giving USA Foundation and written and researched by the Lilly School of Philanthropy at Indiana University, *Giving USA 2021* shows a steep rise in foundation giving, which was up 17%, as well as bequests, which were up by over 10%. Corporate giving was down by over 6.1%.

Notably, individual giving, by far the largest category of support for the charity sector at 69% of total giving, only grew by a little more than 2% in 2020. According to the *Chronicle of Philanthropy* in an article posted on June 15, 2021, without MacKenzie Scott's massive \$5.7 billion shot in the arm to hundreds of charities, individual giving would have actually declined by almost a percentage point. Scott, the former wife of Amazon founder Jeff Bezos, is one of the richest women in the world.

Many factors likely contributed to people's willingness or ability to give in 2020. Individuals normally accustomed to giving may have lost jobs or needed to divert funds to a sick relative or childcare rather than to charity, for example. For others, giving may have simply fallen off the radar while balancing telework with homeschooling. Sadly, many struggled with mental health issues in 2020 during the stress of the pandemic and other crises, which may have also affected giving.

Giving USA 2021 also includes a breakdown of what types of charities donors chose to support in 2020. Gifts to groups supporting public and societal benefit increased by over 15%. Giving to human services groups also saw significant gains in 2020, increasing by almost 10%, perhaps partly due to the effects of the pandemic.

Arts, culture, and humanities groups took the biggest hit in 2020. These charities saw a 7.5% decrease from 2019 to 2020. Many American may have considered these types of groups as less of a priority given the turmoil of 2020. Somewhat surprisingly, giving to health charities also declined in 2020, with support decreasing by 3%. The reasons for losses in this category are trickier to parse out, but it may be that donors were more focused on responding to crisis response organizations. Medical research, for example, might have taken a back seat to direct support of those involved with boots on the ground involvement combatting COVID.

It's hard to predict with any certainty what giving figures in 2021 will look like given the fluctuations of the stock market, unemployment rates, the state of the pandemic and a host of other variables. One analysis from the Association of Fundraising Professionals Foundation for Philanthropy and GivingTuesday found that giving was up 6% in the first quarter of 2021 and saw a 10% increase in donors compared to the same time period in 2020.

No matter what the giving landscape looks like in 2020, we encourage donors, as always, to continue to look to BBB WGA charity reports before making giving decisions. While natural to give to organizations helping with the pandemic or pressing social issues, keep in mind that other groups need your support too. If you have a little money to spare, remember that charities supporting arts and culture, as well as health, need your sustained support, and charities can't rely on massive gifts from billionaires to keep the lights on year to year. They count on individual donors like you to achieve their missions.

How to Read the List of National Charities

he following is an alphabetical listing of the charities that are the subjects of BBB Wise Giving Alliance evaluations. The list includes organizations that have requested to be evaluated as well as those that have received the highest volume of inquiries. The BBB WGA receives inquiries through the mail, phone, e-mail and referrals from local Better Business Bureaus.

Please note the following explanations about this list:

Name Inclusion: Inclusion on this list should not be interpreted as approval or disapproval of a charity. The information in this listing is intended solely to assist donors in exercising their own judgment.



Name Omission: Omission from this list should not be interpreted as meaning that a charity meets or does not meet standards. In general, it simply means that the BBB WGA has not developed a report because it has not received recent inquiries about a charity or a charity has not requested to be evaluated.

Latest Results: This list reflects the latest charity report results as of July 22, 2021. Charity reports are available until their expiration dates, generally two years after their completion. All reports are based on the BBB Wise Giving Alliance Standards for Charity Accountability.

Are you looking for a national charity that's not on our list? Ask us about specific national charities not currently included. Encourage national charities we don't currently report about to contact us about enrolling online (there's never a charge for evaluation). In either way, you can help expand the list.

Note to readers about "see entry for"

Charities sometimes use several names in their materials. In some cases the variation is only slight, such as using an acronym for the full name. In other cases, the names have no self-evident connection, as, for example, the official corporate name and a name used in fund raising. In still others, different individual names may denote different programs of the same organization. This list includes all names currently used by a charity, but the evaluation status of that charity appears only under the main entry. White horizontal bars indicate an alternate name, and refer you to the evaluation listing.

Definitions for the List's Column Headings

Accredited (Met Standards) — Charities with a green check box In the first column next to their name met the 20 Standards for Charity Accountability on pages 44-45. There is no charge to charities for the accreditation evaluation.

Standards Not Met — If a charity has number codes (for example: 3, 6, 7) in the second column with a yellow X mark that means the charity did not meet cited provision(s) of the BBB Charity Standards on pages 44-45.

Unable to Verify — If a charity has number codes (for example: 8, 9, 13) in the column with a blue question mark that means the BBB WGA was unable to verify if the charity met the cited provision(s) of the BBB Charity Standards on pages 44–45. This designation indicates that the charity either did not provide all of the requested information or the information provided was not sufficient to conclude that they met the cited standard(s).

Did Not Disclose — If a charity has a red exclamation mark the charitable organization either has not responded to written BBB WGA requests for information or has declined to be evaluated in relation to the BBB Standards for Charity Accountability. Charity participation in the BBB WGA's review is voluntary. However, without the requested information, it is not possible to determine whether these charities adhere to all of the BBB Standards for Charity Accountability. The BBB WGA encourages charities to disclose accountability information beyond that typically included in financial statements and government filings, in order to demonstrate transparency and strengthen public trust in the charitable sector. The majority of national charities contacted by BBB WGA provide information and participate in the BBB WGA's evaluation program.

Review in Progress — Charities with a in the column marked Review in Progress are being routinely evaluated based on current materials provided by the organization to the BBB WGA.

Q&A about BBB Wise Giving Alliance

• How is BBB WGA different from other charity evaluators?

A BBB WGA is a **standards-based** charity monitoring organization that addresses a variety of issues besides just financial metrics. BBB Charity Standards, include, but are not limited to, such issues as: board oversight, results reporting, appeal accuracy, annual report availability, cause-related marketing disclosures, and responsiveness to donor complaints. While charity finances are important, solely focusing on them will result in an incomplete picture of a charity's accountability. See the full list of our 20 standards at the end of this *Guide*.

Q Does BBB WGA rate or grade charities?

A No. Charities are not rated against one another. A BBB WGA evaluation concludes either that a charity meets all the standards or does not meet certain ones, for reasons described in the report. Whatever the conclusion, the report does not represent approval or disapproval of the organization or its cause. BBB WGA does not suggest that prospective contributors give, or not give, to any particular organization.

Q How does the BBB WGA decide which charities to review?

A Inquiries from the public about a particular national charity prompt a BBB WGA letter requesting that the charity file information for a review. These inquiries come to us directly, by mail, phone, e-mail, and in referrals from local Better Business Bureaus. In addition, charities may file information for a review on their own initiative. In either case, BBB WGA determines whether the charity is soliciting nationally before it requests information. *There is no charge to charities for being evaluated.*

atch for the seal in a charity's mailings, on its website, in newspaper and magazine advertisements, on TV, in public service announcements, and elsewhere. The seal means the national charity displaying it meets the comprehensive standards of the BBB Wise Giving Alliance.

Use of the seal is entirely voluntary. Not every national charity that meets the standards will choose to participate in the seal program. Participants sign a license agreement and pay a sliding-scale fee based on their total contributions in the past year. A national charity is eligible to apply for participation in the seal program only after an evaluation concludes that the charity meets standards. Licensing fees help BBB WGA cover its expenses.

Occasionally donors ask BBB WGA whether licensing fees influence the outcome of charity evaluations. The answer is no. Our analyst staff is very thorough for each evaluation completed. After a charity report is posted online that shows the organization meets all 20 standards, a separate marketing staff then contacts the charity to invite them to consider participating in the seal program. In addition to this separation of the analytical and licensing processes, BBB WGA ensures that seal participants are reviewed with the same frequency (every two years) as other national charities. Since the inception of the Accredited Charity Seal, about 9% of participating charities were dropped from the seal program as the charity either no longer met standards or did not provide requested updated information. BBB WGA's commitment to objectivity is unwavering. We know that the public's trust in our work is essential to our credibility.

BBB Standards for Charity Accountability

After a three-year period, drawing on independent research on donor expectations, professional and technical assistance from a variety of philanthropic experts, and numerous comments from donors and charities, the BBB Wise Giving Alliance issued the *Standards for Charity Accountability*.

The full text of the new standards, with a preface and an Implementation Guide describing how the Alliance applies them, is accessible on our website, www.give.org.

GOVERNANCE AND OVERSIGHT

The governing board has the ultimate oversight authority for any charitable organization. This section of the standards seeks to ensure that the volunteer board is active, independent and free of self-dealing. To meet these standards, the organization shall have:

- **1.** A board of directors that provides adequate oversight of the charity's operations and its staff. Indication of adequate oversight includes, but is not limited to, regularly scheduled appraisals of the CEO's performance, evidence of disbursement controls such as board approval of the budget and fund raising practices, establishment of a conflict of interest policy and establishment of accounting procedures sufficient to safeguard charity finances.
- **2.** A board of directors with a minimum of five voting members.
- **3.** A minimum of three evenly spaced meetings per year of the full governing body with a majority in attendance, with face-to-face participation. A conference call of the full board can substitute for one of the three meetings of the governing body. For all meetings, alternative modes of participation are acceptable for those with physical disabilities.
- 4. Not more than one or 10% (whichever is greater) directly or indirectly compensated person(s) serving as voting member(s) of the board. Compensated members shall not serve as the board's chair or treasurer. [Publicly soliciting churches and other houses of worship: see the Implementation Guide at www.give.org for further information about the application of this standard.]
- **5.** No transaction(s) in which any board or staff members have material conflicting interests with the charity resulting from any relationship or business affiliation. Factors that will be considered when concluding whether or not a related party transaction constitutes a conflict of interest and if such a conflict is material, include, but are not limited to: any arm's length procedures established by the charity; the size of the transaction relative to like expenses of

the charity; whether the interested party participated in the board vote on the transaction; if competitive bids were sought and whether the transaction is one-time, recurring or ongoing.

MEASURING EFFECTIVENESS

An organization should regularly assess its effectiveness in achieving its mission. This section seeks to ensure that an organization has defined, measurable goals and objectives in place and a defined process in place to evaluate the success and impact of its program(s) in fulfilling the goals and objectives of the organization and that also identifies ways to address any deficiencies. To meet these standards, a charitable organization shall:

- **6.** Have a board policy of assessing, no less than every two years, the organization's performance and effectiveness and of determining future actions required to achieve its mission.
- **7.** Submit to the organization's governing body, for its approval, a written report that outlines the results of the aforementioned performance and effectiveness assessment and recommendations for future actions.

FINANCES

This section of the standards seeks to ensure that the charity spends its funds honestly, prudently and in accordance with statements made in fund raising appeals. To meet these standards, the charitable organization shall:

Please note that standards 8 and 9 have different denominators.

8. Spend at least 65% of its <u>total expenses</u> on program activities.

Formula for Standard 8:

Total Program Service Expenses

should be at least 65%

Total Expenses

9. Spend no more than 35% of <u>related contributions</u> on fund raising. Related contributions include donations, legacies and other gifts received as a result of fund raising efforts.

Formula for Standard 9:

Total Fund Raising Expenses

Total Related Contributions

should be no more than 35%

10. Avoid accumulating funds that could be used for current program activities. To meet this standard, the charity's unrestricted net assets available for use should not be more than three times the size of the past year's expenses or three times the size of the current year's budget, whichever is higher. [Meeting certain public disclosure requirements described in the Implementation Guide at www.give.org may enable a charity to satisfy this standard.]

An organization that does not meet Standards 8, 9 and/or 10 may provide evidence to demonstrate that its use of funds is reasonable. The higher fund raising and administrative costs of a newly created organization, donor restrictions on the use of funds, exceptional bequests, a stigma associated with a cause and environmental or political events beyond an organization's control are among factors which may result in expenditures that are reasonable although they do not meet the financial measures cited in these standards.

- 11. Make available to all, on request, complete annual financial statements prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. When total annual gross income exceeds \$1,000,000, these statements should be audited in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For charities whose annual gross income is less than \$1,000,000, a review by a certified public accountant is sufficient to meet this standard. For charities whose annual gross income is less than \$250,000, an internally produced, complete financial statement is sufficient to meet this standard.
- 12. Include in the financial statements a breakdown of expenses (e.g., salaries, travel, postage, etc.) that shows what portion of these expenses was allocated to program, fund raising and administrative activities. If the charity has more than one major program category, the schedule should provide a breakdown for each category.
- any joint cost allocations, in its financial statements. For example, audited or unaudited statements which inaccurately claim zero fund raising expenses or otherwise understate the amount a charity spends on fund raising, and/or overstate the amount it spends on programs will not meet this standard.

13. Accurately report the charity's expenses, including

14. Have a board-approved annual budget for its current fiscal year, outlining projected expenses for major program activities, fund raising and administration.

FUND RAISING AND INFORMATIONAL MATERIALS

A fund raising appeal is often the only contact a donor has with a charity and may be the sole impetus for giving. This section of the standards seeks to ensure that a charity's representations to the public are accurate, complete and respectful. To meet these standards, the charitable organization shall:

15. Have solicitations and informational materials, distributed by any means, that are accurate, truthful and not misleading, both in whole and in part.

Appeals that omit a clear description of program(s) for which contributions are sought will not meet this standard.

A charity should also be able to substantiate that the timing and nature of its expenditures are in accordance with what is stated, expressed or implied in the charity's solicitations.

16. Have an annual report available to all, on request, that includes:

- (a) the organization's mission statement,
- (b) a summary of the past year's program service accomplishments,
- (c) a roster of the officers and members of the board of directors,
- (d) financial information that includes:
 - (i) total income in the past fiscal year,
 - (ii) expenses in the same program, fund raising and administrative categories as in the financial statements, and
 - (iii) ending net assets.
- 17. Include on any charity websites that solicit contributions, the same information that is recommended for annual reports, as well as the mailing address of the charity and electronic access to its most recent IRS Form 990.

18. Address privacy concerns of donors by

- (a) providing in written appeals, at least annually, a means (e.g., such as a check off box) for both new and continuing donors to inform the charity if they do not want their name and address shared outside the organization, and
- (b) providing a clear, prominent and easily accessible privacy policy on any of its websites that tells visitors
 - (i) what information, if any, is being collected about them by the charity and how this information will be used,
 - (ii) how to contact the charity to review personal information collected and request corrections,
 - (iii) how to inform the charity (e.g., a check off box) that the visitor does not wish his/her personal information to be shared outside the organization, and
 - (iv) what security measures the charity has in place to protect personal information.
- 19. Clearly disclose how the charity benefits from the sale of products or services (i.e., cause-related marketing) that state or imply that a charity will benefit from a consumer sale or transaction. Such promotions should disclose, at the point of solicitation:
- (a) the actual or anticipated portion of the purchase price that will benefit the charity (e.g., 5 cents will be contributed to abc charity for every xyz company product sold),
- (b) the duration of the campaign (e.g., the month of October),
- (c) any maximum or guaranteed minimum contribution amount (e.g., up to a maximum of \$200,000).
- **20.** Respond promptly to and act on complaints brought to its attention by the BBB Wise Giving Alliance and/or local Better Business Bureaus about fund raising practices, privacy policy violations and/or other issues.
